

DIVISION E: JURY POSTPONEMENT- EXCUSE – EXEMPTION

Most people are eager to perform their civic duty of jury service. However, sometimes the timing of jury service might conflict with a Planned Vacation, Medical Procedure/Disability, Work Schedule or other Personal Circumstance. In those instances you may request a Postponement, Excuse, or even an Exemption from Jury Service.

JURY POSTPONEMENT – You may request your jury service date be changed to another date that is more convenient for you. You will have to arrange with the Court's staff to get a new date.

JURY EXCUSE – If you believe jury service would create an undue hardship or extreme inconvenience you may request to be excused. For instance, if you have a medical condition supported by medical documentation, you may be excused from jury service.

JURY EXEMPTION – If you are seventy (70) years or older you may request to be removed from this jury service or request to be removed permanently from jury service. Also, if you have served on a grand, petit, or central jury pool within the last two (2) years, you may claim an exemption from this jury service.

REMEMBER, YOU ARE NOT FREE FROM YOUR OBLIGATION TO APPEAR FOR JURY SERVICE UNLESS YOU HAVE RECEIVED VERIFICATION THAT YOUR REASON HAS BEEN ACCEPTED BY THE COURT.
